We recognize that the West Island is located on unceded Indigenous lands of the traditional territory of both the Kanien'kehá:ka, Mohawk, and the Anishinabeg Algonquin peoples.

It is right that we should express gratitude for the opportunity to gather here, and we thank the many generations of people who have taken care of this land and these waters. Tiohtiá:ke, now known as Montreal, is historically known as a gathering place for diverse First Nations; thus, we recognize and deeply appreciate the historic and ongoing Indigenous connections to, and presence on, these lands and waters.

In this spirit of peace and thanksgiving, let us remember the verses of Philippians 4, 6-7, from the new First Nations version of the New Testament written and edited by a council of elders with Intervarsity Press:

"Do not let your hearts be weighed down with anything. Instead, with every step you take, send your voice to the Great Spirit (God), asking him for the things you need. And in all your prayers, remember to give him thanks. Then the peace and the harmony of the Great Spirit, which goes far beyond our small and weak ways of thinking, will watch over your hearts and minds through the Chosen one, Creator sets free (Jesus)."


Father, forgive us for our pride, our judgmental spirits, our lack of love and trust in you. Have mercy on us and bless us once again, Father.




We pray for families of all shapes, sizes, colours; of all backgrounds, neurotypes, and (dis)abilities; those with deep faith and those with none.

...bring us together.


